ANGELS OF GOD

September 29: Feast Day of Sts. Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael October 2: Feast Day of Guardian Angels

"Make yourself familiar with the angels and behold them frequently in spirit; for without being seen, they are present with you always." — St. Francis de Sales



Preparation:

Ahead of time, we recommend you find a quiet place in your home where you can immerse yourself in this retreat. Have your child's Emmaus Memorial Candle (or other candle) available along with a lighter or matches.

Take several deep breaths to cleanse your thoughts and open yourself to wherever the Holy Spirit is calling you today several minutes before the retreat is scheduled to begin.

At 9:30am ET open your email and join other fellow Emmaus Parent Companions in getting away from the rest of the world, at least for a time, to focus on God and on your precious child.

CANDLE LIGHTING PRAYER (Light your candle)

We begin... In the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, Amen

Lord, you are the Light of the World. *Help us feel your presence in the lighting of this candle.*

Lord, you gave us the gift of our children. Help us feel their presence in the lighting of this candle.

Lord, you gave us the hope of eternal life. Help us confirm that hope in the lighting of this candle.

Lord, you gave us love. *Help us to know that, as much as we love our children, you love them even more.*

We ask you this through Christ, Our Lord Amen.

PRAYER OF THOSE MAKING A RETREAT

SCRIPTURE READINGS

Ex.23:20-21. "See, I am sending an angel before you, to guard you on the way and bring you to the place I have prepared. Be attentive to him and heed his voice. Do not rebel against him, for he will not forgive your sin. My authority resides in him."

Judith 13:20. "As the same Lord lives, his angel has been my keeper both going hence and abiding there, and returning from there here; and the Lord has not suffered me his handmaid to be defiled, but has brought me back to you without pollution of sin, rejoicing for his victory, for my escape, and for your deliverance."

Psalm 34:8. "The angel of the LORD, who encamps with them, delivers all who fear God."

Psalm 91:11-13. "For God commands the angels to guard you in all your ways. With their hands they shall support you, lest you strike your foot against a stone. You shall tread upon the asp and the viper, trample the lion and the dragon." [God reveals to David that the angels will guard and protect him. Since this Psalm was written about 1,000 years before Christ, the belief in guardian angels was well-established among the Jews.]

Dan. 10:13. "...But the prince of the kingdom of Persia stood in my way for twentyone days, until finally Michael, one of the chief princes, came to help me. I left him there with the prince of the kings of Persia..." [See also Dan. 4:17; 10:10-21; and Acts 16:6 where angels serve as guardians of entire countries.]

Matt.18:10. "See that you do not despise one of these little ones, for I say to you that their angels in heaven always look upon the face of my heavenly Father."

Acts 12:14-15. "She was so overjoyed when she recognized Peter's voice that, instead of opening the gate, she ran in and announced that Peter was standing at the gate. They told her, "You are out of your mind," but she insisted that it was so. But they kept saying, "It is his angel." [This demonstrates that adults also have guardian angels. The phrase "they kept saying" also shows that the belief in guardian angels was common in the early Church.]

Heb. 1:14. "Are they not all ministering spirits sent to serve, for the sake of those who are to inherit salvation?" [This verse clearly indicates that God created the angels to help us achieve salvation.]

REFLECTION #1: <u>Pay Attention to Your Guardian Angel</u> by Fr. Matthias, Franciscan Friars Beside each believer stands an angel as protector and shepherd leading him to life.



Take a moment to pause... breathe... savor what you have received from the Reflection #1.

Clear your mind before focusing on Reflection #2.

REFLECTION #2: <u>All About Angels</u> by Fr. Mark Mary and Fr. Malachy, Franciscan Friars of the Renewal Angels are real.
