Jesus, You Take Over!
Please... get into the boat with us.

Come more deeply into our hearts and lives today. We need you now, more than ever.



Preparation:

Ahead of time, we recommend you find a quiet place in your home where you can immerse yourself in this retreat. Have your child's Emmaus Memorial Candle (or other candle) available along with a lighter or matches.

Take several deep breaths to cleanse your thoughts and open yourself to wherever the Holy Spirit is calling you today several minutes before the retreat is scheduled to begin.

At 9:30am ET open your email and join other fellow Emmaus Parent Companions in getting away from the rest of the world, at least for a time, to focus on God and on your precious child.

CANDLE LIGHTING PRAYER (Light your candle)

We begin... In the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, Amen

Lord, you are the Light of the World. *Help us feel your presence in the lighting of this candle.*

Lord, you gave us the gift of our children. Help us feel their presence in the lighting of this candle.

Lord, you gave us the hope of eternal life. *Help us confirm that hope in the lighting of this candle.*

Lord, you gave us love. Help us to know that, as much as we love our children, you love them even more.

We ask you this through Christ, Our Lord Amen.

OPENING SONG: Anchor Me by The Tenors

PRAYER OF THOSE MAKING A RETREAT

SCRIPTURE READING Mark 6:45-52

After the five thousand had eaten and were satisfied, Jesus made his disciples get into the boat and precede him to the other side toward Bethsaida, while he dismissed the crowd.

And when he had taken leave of them, he went off to the mountain to pray.

When it was evening, the boat was far out on the sea and he was alone on shore.

Then he saw that they were tossed about while rowing, for the wind was against them.

About the fourth watch of the night, he came toward them walking on the sea.

He meant to pass by them. But when they saw him walking on the sea, they thought it was a ghost and cried out.

They had all seen him and were terrified. But at once he spoke with them, "Take courage, it is I, do not be afraid!" He got into the boat with them and the wind died down. They were completely astounded.

They had not understood the incident of the loaves. On the contrary, their hearts were hardened.

REFLECTION #2: Take Care; Do Not Fear by My Catholic Life He is walking toward you in the midst of whatever you are struggling with, saying to you, "Take courage, it is I, do not be afraid!"

PRAYER

Lord, I trust in your almighty power and unconditional love.

I trust that you care about me and are present in every storm I face in life.

Give me hope in the midst of every trial and enable me to turn to you as the source of my peace.

I love you, dear Lord.

Jesus, I trust in you.

Amen.


