Dear Friends:

It is all too familiar...

You turn on your phone or open a newspaper and read about *a precious seven-yearold little boy who drowned in his uncle's pool... a young woman, with everything to live for, who takes her own life for no apparent reason... a successful professional who dies of a drug overdose.* There are school shootings, horrific murders, tragic accidents, fatal illnesses, and unexpected suicides in the news every day. Most of them leave behind devastated parents brought to their knees by the pain of the worse loss of *all. All of which is complicated by the challenges of a pandemic.*

If you are like many of us,

you want to reach out to these grieving parents to tell them that they are not alone, that you understand on some level, and that we, as fellow grieving parents, stand solidly with them and are holding them in prayer.

Each month, we ask all Emmaus parents to pray for newly bereaved parents. In addition, Bro. John Maganzini, ofm. lights a candle in loving memory of these children at St. Anthony Shrine in Boston, MA.



You can mail these cards to parents you hear about or see on your local newscasts. (No need to send us individual names or any details; we pray for all of them collectively.)

Just tell us how many Emmaus sympathy cards you would like (email <u>diane@emfgp.org</u>). Typically, we send out sets of 5 or 10 or 20 cards and envelopes, so you will have them on hand whenever you hear or read about other grieving parents.

Hopefully, newly-bereaved parents will feel some sense of comfort in knowing that they are not alone and that they and their children are in all of our prayers. It is a beautiful way to reach out to each other in our pain. It is a beautiful way to memorialize our children.
