We all know the meaning of Good Friday, the day when Jesus died on the cross for our sins.

The same is true of Easter Sunday, the day when he rose from the dead in triumph over death.

But what about Holy Saturday?

What does this day commemorate?

Preparation:

Ahead of time, we recommend you find a quiet place in your home where you can immerse yourself in this retreat. Have your child's Emmaus Memorial Candle (or other candle) available along with a lighter or matches.

Take several deep breaths to cleanse your thoughts and open yourself to wherever the Holy Spirit is calling you today several minutes before the retreat is scheduled to begin.

At 9:30am ET open your email and join other fellow Emmaus Parent Companions in getting away from the rest of the world, at least for a time, to focus on God and on your precious child.

CANDLE LIGHTING PRAYER (Light your candle)

We begin... In the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, Amen

Lord, you are the Light of the World. *Help us feel your presence in the lighting of this candle.*

Lord, you gave us the gift of our children. *Help us feel their presence in the lighting of this candle.*

Lord, you gave us the hope of eternal life. Help us confirm that hope in the lighting of

this candle.

Lord, you gave us love. *Help us to know that, as much as we love our children, you love them even more.*

We ask you this through Christ, Our Lord Amen.

PRAYER OF THOSE MAKING A RETREAT

SCRIPTURE READING 1 Peter 3: 13-22

Now who is going to harm you if you are enthusiastic for what is good?

But even if you should suffer because of righteousness, blessed are you. Do not be afraid or terrified with fear of them, but sanctify Christ as Lord in your hearts.

Always be ready to give an explanation to anyone who asks you for a reason for your hope, but do it with gentleness and reverence, keeping your conscience clear, so that, when you are maligned, those who defame your good conduct in Christ may themselves be put to shame.

For it is better to suffer for doing good, if that be the will of God, than for doing evil.

For Christ also suffered for sins once, the righteous for the sake of the unrighteous, that he might lead you to God. Put to death in the flesh, he was brought to life in the spirit.

In it he also went to preach to the souls in prison, who had once been disobedient while God patiently waited in the days of Noah during the building of the ark, in which a few persons, eight in all, were saved through water.

This prefigured baptism, which saves you now. It is not a removal of dirt from the body but an appeal to God for a clear conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers subject to him.

REFLECTION #2: <u>An Ancient Homily on Holy Saturday</u> (attributed by some to Bishop Melito of Sardis around A.D. 165) Jesus said to the souls in prison, "Awake, O sleeper, and rise from the dead."

PRAYER

SAVING GOD,

All creation on this day waits with groaning and longing for the salvation promised to our ancestors, and revealed in the resurrection of your Son Jesus.

Teach us how to wait for the bursting forth of your saving power when all will be reconciled to you in Christ Jesus.

We wait in hope, O God.

We wait in the company of all the angels and saints of heaven. Through their intercession may we have the power to say: *"Holy, Holy, Holy is our God."*

Amen.
